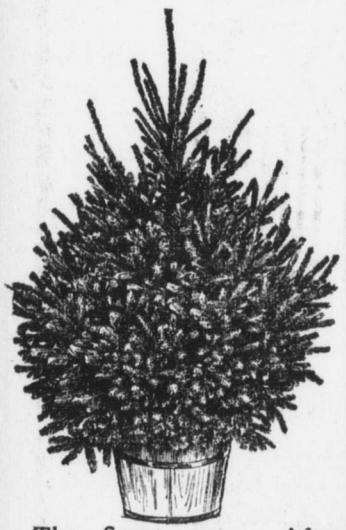

### NEW WAGONS ORDERED FOR SCHMIDT BAKING COMPANY

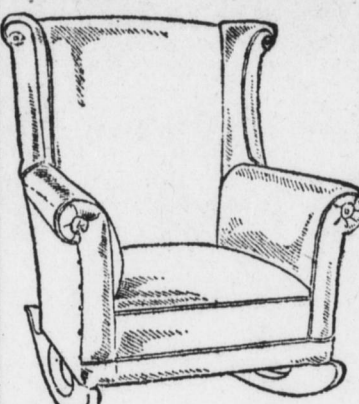

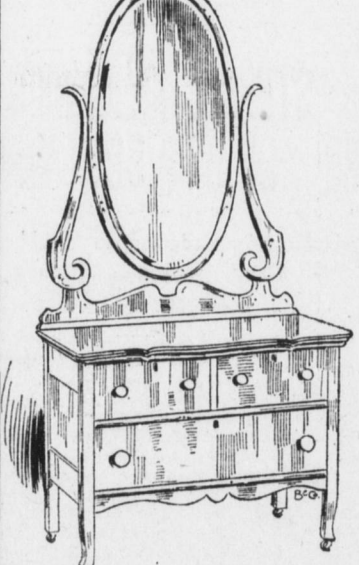
