100,000 Phones in Hbg. Division of Bell Company

10,000 in Local District Alone; Big Men in Business Got Start Here

the plant department installs the telephones and sees that they are kept in working condition. The traffic department operates the telephones and has charge of its operating force, while the auditor or properly bills each month. The local employees, which it may be interesting to note, number 223, are very much interested in the growth of the company's business at this time, because the next few days will bring the number of subscribers' stations to the one hundred thousand mark. On the first of December the records for the Harrisburg division showed 95,563 telephones and at the time the company has been going, it will be just a few days before the one hundred thousand mark is attained. This figure does not include what the company terms connecting company service stations. These latter stations are those of small rural companies which connect with the Bell and which in the aggregate amount to about 30,000 in the Harrisburg division.

8,500 Phones in City Alone

In Harrisburg alone, there are about 8,500 telephones with 1,000 additional in the cross-the-river towns and Steelton.

When one of the Bell officials was asked if the attainment of the one hundred thousand mark would bring with it any kind of a celebration, he replied "the times are not particularly propitious for any celebration which requires the expenditure of money."

Since the merger of the Pennsylvania Telephone Company with the Bell Telephone Company of Philadelphia, many Harrisburgers are under the impression that this city is no longer headquarters for the Bell Telephone Company. This is far from being a fact, for the only change that took place with the merger a few years ago, was that the executive offices were moved to Philadelphia.

Harrisburg is the headquarters of what the Bell people term the Harrisburg division, comprising more than 25,000 square miles and including forty counties in Pennsylvania and two in New Jersey. At the head of the Harrisburg division are G. S. Reinoehl, division manager; H. B. Porter, plant superintendent; J. T. Hart, traffic superintendent; and C. E. Booser, division auditor of receipts.
