ACTIVE ISSUES IN MARKETS UNCHANGED

Reading Was Only Stock to Move More Than a Slight Fraction

By Associated Press. New York, Dec. 23. - Early trading in to-day's stock market indicated a continuance of the recent dull and narrow movement. Activity of the active issues were unchanged or at fractions above and below yesterday's closing. Reading was the only stock to move more than a slight fraction, gaining 3/8 which it soon lost, and was a trifle lower at the outset, but recovered on dealings which included a block at 1,000 shares. Otherwise the overture was in small lots and by the end of the first thirty minutes business fell away to minor proportions with a lower trend.
