"Ex-Senator Cameron has been out of the public eye since 1897, when he retired as United States senator from Pennsylvania. He is now 81 years old and has lived on his estates in Donegal, Lancaster county. He made his fortune largely in reorganizing the Northern Central Railroad, of which he was president from 1863 to 1874. He is also interested in large coal and fron mines. Mr. Cameron was once a power in Pennsylvania politics, succeeding to the legacy left by his father, and with Quay was long a recognized leader. He served two years as Secretary of War in President Grant's Cabinet and succeeded his father in the United States Senate in 1877."
