STOCKS HIGHER AT OPENING OF MARKETS

Bethlehem Dominated During Early Hours, Common Going to Its Highest Point in Years

New York, Jan. 4. -- Opening dealings in the stock market here today were more or less at variance with quotations for our stocks in London, where trading was resumed after a suspension of more than five months. With the exception of United States Steel and Pennsylvania, which declined more fractions, most of other stocks were a trifle higher, although the dull movement was confined practically to shares of the inactive group. Bethlehem Steel, Common and Preferred, dominated the early market, the common rising to its highest price in several years. Anaconda Copper was the only American issue to show any advance abroad.

Washington, Jan. 4. --Representative Gardner urging his proposal to investigate the military preparedness of the nation, told the House Military Committee today that the "entire field army, militia, regulars and all of the United States would just about equal the number of guns Russia had at the battle of Mukden."

Services For Victim of Auto Smash-up Tomorrow

Funeral services for Miss Grace Maugan, aged 25 years, 310 Forster street, who died early Saturday morning from injuries she received in an automobile accident at Front and Walnut streets late Friday night, will be held at the home to-morrow afternoon at 2 o'clock, at the Rev. B. H. Hays, pastor of the Fifth Street Methodist Church, officiating. Burial will be made in Paxtang Cemetery. The pallbearers will be Harry and Gene DeLone, Ross and Francis Simmet, Albert Senior and "Bud" Commins. Miss Lillian Swails, T. Elder Cleckner and Samuel Weber, three others who were injured in the accident and were taken to the Harrisburg Hospital, are reported improving and will probably leave the hospital in the next few days. Coroner Eckinger will not hold an inquest until these three leave the hospital and can come as witnesses to the hearing.

Works Old Sympathy C. O. D. Game, Is Charge

That old crooked C. O. D. game-- sending packages to the address of persons who died recently-- will be explained at the police station to-morrow afternoon, Mayor John K. Hoyt will give a hearing to J. H. Chapman, alias B. F. Brown, on a charge of false pretense. Chapman was arrested in Lewistown Saturday on information from Herbert E. Lucas, post office inspector. Inspector Lucas believes he has a Federal case against Chapman, who also used the name of the Adams Express Company. To the address of the deceased he sent C. O. D. packages containing cheap jewelry, and left the collection of two and three dollars bill to the express company. Chapman has retained Robert Stucker as his attorney.

BOY WILL LOSE LEG

Mifflinburg, Pa., Jan. 4. --William Jolly, 13 years old, son of Mr. and Mrs. Erwin Jolly, living about ten miles west of Mifflinburg, met with a serious accident on Saturday while visiting a set of muskrat traps which the boy operated to earn money to help support the family. His musket was accidentally discharged, the load striking him in the right leg below the knee, breaking the bone and tearing away the muscles. After the accident the boy crawled about a hundred yards and then called his little sister, who pulled him home on a small hand sled. Medical aid was summoned and the boy was taken to the Mary Packer Hospital at Sunbury, where it is thought the leg will have to be amputated.

WANT WAR SHIPMENTS STOPPED

Washington, Jan. 4. --Delegations from New York, Philadelphia, Chicago and Baltimore, among them representatives of the German-American Alliance and the Ancient Order of Illiberians, appeared to-day before the House Foreign Affairs Committee to favor pending Congressional resolutions to stop exports of war materials to the European belligerents.
