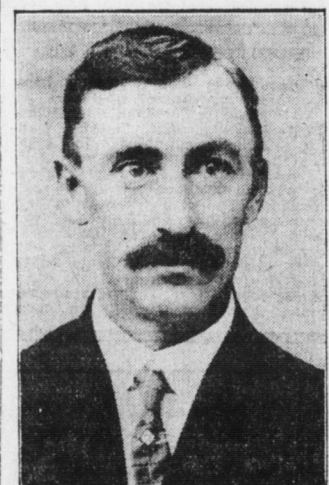

For sixteen years---or since the very beginning of Steelton's free delivery service---Levi Roth and George Byrod, two members of the mail delivery force at the Steelton Post Office, have been making their daily rounds, distributing good cheer as well as mail. ### SONS OF BALKANS OBSERVE CHRISTMAS

Four thousand members of the Greek, Servian and Bulgarian Orthodox Churches gathered in Steelton today to celebrate Christmas, which, in their church calendar, falls thirteen days later than in the Julian calendar. More than 1,000 pigs have already been slaughtered and roasted for the feast, which will last three days. The preparations for the festival began Monday evening and by last night the hills for miles back of Steelton resembled an encamped army, so close together were the fires over which the fat, juicy porkers were roasting. Beside each fire a swarthy foreigner squatted and slowly turned the long green sapling upon which the pig roasted. Shortly after masses in St. Nicholas' Servian and the Bulgarian Orthodox Churches this morning, thousands of the celebrators joined hands in two long lines along each side of South Third and other streets in the big foreign section and danced old folk dances.
