New York, Jan. 20. - The swift pace maintained by yesterday's market measured further profit taking at the outset of to-day's session, most of the leaders yielding fractionally, with a loss of 1/4 for Canadian Pacific and one point for Bethlehem Steel. The preferred shares of the latter company gained 1/4, however, in recognition of its increased dividend. Rumeley commodity advanced to a lower price as a result of receivership proceedings. The list stiffened perceptibly before the end of the half-hour under the lead of Union Pacific.
