FARMERS TURNING TO AUTOMOBILES

Seven Per Cent. of the Grangers Said to Own Machines For Pleasure or Marketing

Figures compiled by L. H. Wibbe, chief of statistics of the State Department of Agriculture, from reports made to him from every county indicate that seven per cent. of the farmers in Pennsylvania own automobiles. It is estimated by him that at least 15,000 automobiles are owned on farms and they are employed not only for getting about to make purchases and for pleasure, to go to church and meetings, but for marketing and for hauling purposes. It is his belief that this year will see a big increase in the number of automobiles owned by farmers, who are getting good prices now and for whose use many makes of cars are being manufactured.
