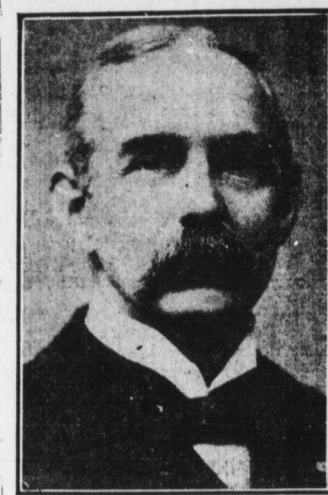

Hundreds of Endeavorers Will March to Big Rally Tonight, Which Will Mark Close of Week's Observance



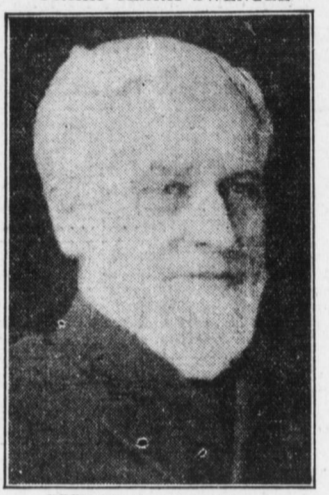

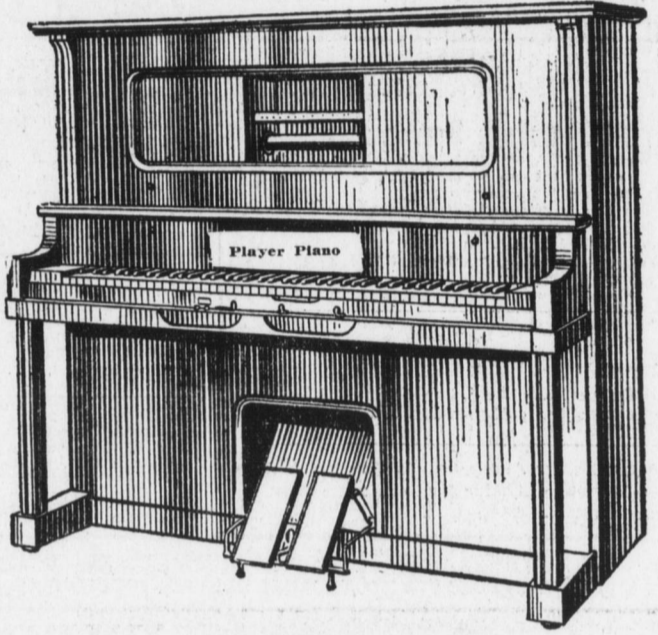
