New York, Feb. 23.—Resumption of trading in stocks after the double holiday was characterized by greater activity in all parts of the list. The local market taking its cue from London, where international issues were lower. Demand ranged from one to two points in important stocks, United States Steel showing more steadiness than any of the speculative favorites. American Car and Seaboard Air Line, Pfd., fell to their new minimums and Baltimore and Ohio and New Haven were within fractions. Miscellaneous shares also weakened.
