"City Forester Harry J. Mueller sum-med up his advice to Harrisburg folks to-day in discussing the care and maintenance of trees and the rela-tion the recently created department will bear toward the citizen who is considering pruning and trimming. "To secure the best results obtain-able in street decoration," went on the forester, "we must have the hearty co-operation of every citizen in the entipy city. This department will endeavor to advise how and what to plant, who is competent to do pruning and who is not. We will attend to the pruning and general care of your trees free of expense in regular order as the re-quests come in." "City Forester Mueller than discussed the effect of the municipal control of trees, of how the same provision prac-tically which applies to the property owner and the paving in front of his property, is equally true of the trees. The shade tree is a permanent im-provement to the highway, he said. "A man," concluded Mr. Mueller, "may plant a shade tree along the tree line but he does not own if in the sense that he owns the trees within his prop-erty line.
