LEGISLATIVE NEWS

GOVERNOR GIVEN HEAVY SUPPORT

His Local Option Campaign Is Being Backed Up All Over the Keystone State

Governor Martin G. Brumbaugh does not intend to allow any grass to grow under his feet in his campaign in behalf of the local option bill.

Next week the Governor will talk to more legislators and the senatorial caucus will be asked to see him as soon as they return next week.

The Governor's mail is filled with expressions of commendation of his stand and telegrams are being received from almost every county.

The Governor said last night that he was satisfied that the people are behind him in his campaign for local option and pointed to a pile of letters and telegrams when he said it.

Among letters received at the Governor's office have been:

To the House of Representatives: "The election by a very large majority of Dr. Martin G. Brumbaugh to the governorship on a personal pledge, strongly commends to county local option, would indicate that the people of this state are overwhelmingly in favor of this legislation.

After unanimous adoption, by a ringing vote, this resolution was placed in my hands with direction that I deliver it personally to the Hon. Martin G. Brumbaugh, Governor of the State of Pennsylvania.

The Governor received the following telegrams: From the Rev. E. B. Wolf, of Homestead: "A mass meeting of citizens in the First Methodist Episcopal Church pledge you their earnest support and co-operation in your fight for county local option in Pennsylvania.

From Miss Rebecca N. Rhoads, president of the Centre County Women's Christian Temperance Union: "Centre County Women's Christian Temperance Union sends heartfelt thanks for your noble, brave and rigorous local option. May God abundantly bless you."

HUNTERS' LICENSE REPEALER DEAD

House Game Committee Puts a Quiet on the Measure For Abolishing the Law

The bill to repeal the hunters' license law of 1912 was given short shrift by the House committee on game last night and will be negatively reported when the House meets on Monday night.

The committee also killed the Garner bill for game commissions of three to be named in each county by the local authorities.

James B. Sanson, representing the Wild Life League; E. A. Weimer, the conservation conference; John Gable, representing United Sportsmen, and John Martin representing State Sportsmen's Association appeared before the committee on November 1 to 13.

The sportsmen's delegation also saw Governor Brumbaugh and urged him to secure speedy action on the bill making available for game propagation this Spring and summer the revenue from the hunters' license law.

LAUNCH CEREMONY WILL BE FORMAL
