FAITH, CARRANZA'S BELIEF

Vera Cruz, Mexico, March 10.—A declaration that General Obregon had acted in good faith in his efforts to relieve the sufferings of the poor in Mexico City and a denial of charges that he had prevented the distribution of food supplies or otherwise acted in a way calculated to complicate the situation is the substance of a statement prepared by Alberto J. Pani, head of the National Railways, for Charles A. Douglass, General Carranza's Washington attorney, who is now here. It is understood that this statement will be included in one which is to be delivered to the State Department at Washington.

Pani asserted that General Obregon was idolized by the poor of Mexico City and that conditions there which have aroused protests were due, not to him, but to the adroit opposition of wealthy residents, instituted with the object of bringing Obregon and the Constitutionalist cause into disrepute.
