### TABERNACLE COMPLETED

Volunteers Finish Work on Marysville Structure For Hillis Campaign

Marysville, Pa., March 10.—Erection of the Hillis tabernacle was completed yesterday after two days' work. About fifty Marysville men turned out, also Captain Neilsen, of the Salvation Army, of Harrisburg, and H. A. Blum, of Mechanicsburg, and were busy with hammer and saw shortly after 7 o'clock Monday morning. Both days dinner and supper was served to the workmen at the Methodist Church.

The tabernacle is 100 feet long and 57 wide. The seating capacity of the chorus section will be about 250, while the tabernacle will hold 1,800 people.

To-night Mrs. Hillis will speak in the United Evangelical Church and on Thursday evening in the Methodist Church. Dedicatory night will be Friday, and the campaign will be opened by the Rev. Mr. Hillis next Sunday evening.

### Lebanon Property Owners Resist Paving Assessment

Lebanon, March 10.—Despite the action of Councilman George F. Krause in publicly offering two months' salary—\$125—to start a fund to pay the assessments of property owners who refuse to pay their street paving assessments, and offers of others to contribute to the same fund, six prominent citizens have filed a suit in equity in the local court, endeavoring to enjoin the city from collecting the assessments for the woodblock paving laid last Fall—the first permanent paving the city has ever had. The complainants are John Hunsicker, Sr., Dr. George M. Pochel, Assessor; Harry A. Asa, A. Weiner, Harry Stoudt, Adam P. Miller estate, and D. P. Witmeyer.

### DIES BEFORE OPERATION

Gettysburg, March 10.—C. William Troxell, bookkeeper at the Citizens' Trust company for the past 12 years, died at the Jefferson hospital, Philadelphia, Monday night, of an abscess. Mr. Troxell was taken to the hospital Monday morning and while en route to the institution suffered an attack of heart trouble which caused his death before an operation, which was planned, could be performed. ## ADAMS COUNTY FRUIT INDUSTRY IS SHOWN

### Report of Tenth Annual Convention of Growers Gives Astonishing Figures

Gettysburg, March 10.—Importance of the fruit and vegetable industry of Adams county is set forth in the handsomely printed report of the tenth annual convention of the Adams county Fruit Growers, covering the proceedings of the meeting held in Bendersville last December.

A comparative table establishes the fact that 1914 was a year of bumper crops all along the line of fruit production. In 1914 196,859 barrels of apples were produced, the previous record being a crop of 177,595 barrels in 1911. On the basis of 150 barrels to a carload, it took 1309 cars to transport the barreled apples alone. In addition there were shipped from various parts of the county, 19 carloads of potatoes, 132 carloads of peaches; 7 carloads of pears; 157 carloads of canned apples; 3 carloads of evaporated apples, 16 carloads of cider syrup; 5 carloads of cabbage, and one carload of cherries.
