

Supreme Court Justice Decides He Cannot Be Returned to New Hampshire

New York, March 16—Harry K. Thaw will not be sent back to New Hampshire by the state of New York as his counsel demanded, but must be returned to Matteawan Asylum, unless legal papers calling for his detention in New York county are served upon the warden of Tombs Prison. This was Supreme Court Justice Page's decision today in disposing of the formal motion to have Thaw returned to New England.

In the meantime counsel for Thaw, as if in anticipation of such a decision, had obtained from Supreme Court Justice Bijur a writ of habeas corpus which will keep Thaw in Tombs Prison till next Friday when he must be produced in court.

It was a close call for Thaw as plans had been considered by the state for returning him at once to Matteawan. Asylum attendants were in the court room ready to rush him there by automobile, but the writ of habeas corpus prevented this.

Many more armed deputies were sprinkled among the crowds in the corridors.
