Portable Plan Best, Says Diehl In speaking of the plan to-day Mr. Diehl said he only referred to my probable intention of submitting the question of portable meters to council applied to such time as the electric company's reconstruction work is completed. Personally, I think the portable plan is the best as it permits the investigation and accurate testing of any trouble at any point on the streets, whereas the permanently located meters cover only the districts in which they are located. This may show absolute efficiency all the time whereas at other points on the system the meters are not available.
