Who Had Two Horses Shot from Under Him in War

William F. Starry, a veteran of the Civil War, was given a rousing seventieth birthday surprise yesterday by his fellow-employees at the Harrisburg Collar and Cuff Company plant, where he is manager of the shipping department. After work Mr. Starry carried his gifts home and had the additional pleasure of surprising his wife. He lives at 226 South Seventeenth street.

Mr. Starry had an interesting career in the Civil War, having gone through eighteen battles and having had two horses shot from under him. He enlisted when 19 years of age under peculiar circumstances. While viewing the battle of Gettysburg he was captured and sent to a southern prison. He escaped at the first opportunity, came north, enlisted and served during the remainder of the war.

He fought with Sheridan's army in the Twenty-first Pennsylvania Cavalry. Among the battles he went through were Malvern Hill, Chickahominy, Poplar Grove, Hatcher's Run, Bellfield, Boynton Road, Spottsylvania, Cold Harbor, Siege of Petersburg and the surrender of Lee at Appomattox. Mr. Starry was formerly a contractor.
