SUBMERGED PIPE LINE

Novel methods and equipment are being used in laying a submerged pipe line across the Narrows to convey water from Brooklyn to State Island. The distance from shore to shore is about 10,000 feet and the line extends across the busiest lanes of traffic to and from the port of New York. In some places the depth of water is as great as seventy-four feet. The pipe line is made up of thirty-six-inch cast-iron pipe in twelve-foot lengths and provided with flexible joints. It is laid in a treach dredged out of the bottom of the channel and is to be covered over as soon as completed. The ingenious method of laying the pipe is shown by an illustration in the Popular Mechanics.


