

Gross earnings for 35 railroads decreased during two weeks in March. Reports, however, show some improvement, according to Edward B. Smith and Company, bankers, of New York and Philadelphia. This firm in its Weekly Sentiment says:

"Gross earnings of thirty-five railroads during the second week of March decreased 12.80 per cent, in comparison with the same week last year. There is a well defined tendency toward improvement in the net earnings of railroad companies operating within the United States. It is expected this improvement may continue following a further conservation of revenues to effect which railroad managers are exerting themselves to the utmost."
