New York, April 5.—Very active trading at higher prices marked the resumption of operations on the Stock Exchange to-day. Some of the specialties rose from two to four points, Bethlehem Steel selling at new high point of 92. American Locomotive rose over five points and the motor shares were again exceptional. Substantial advances, Cuban-American Sugar jumped six points and reacted five. Among imports, steel, less Union Pacific and Reading alone gained a full point. Rock Island was active and strong, likewise the Erie group. Profit-taking reduced many of the gains before the end of the half hour.
