BUY 5 MORE PIECES OF MOTOR APPARATUS

Taylor's Bargain For City Is Approved by Council; Mayor and Gorgas, of Course, Object

Council this afternoon decided to buy two Christie type front drive tractors for steamers, an American La France tractor for the hook and ladder truck and two American La France combination motor chemicals—all for \$18,000—as recommended by Commissioner M. Harvey Taylor, superintendent of parks and public property.

Mayor Royal, however, admitted that the city will get the advantage of an exceptional bargain by adopting Mr. Taylor's recommendation.

Action on the ordinance authorizing the city to purchase the Fourth and Emerald street plot for playground purposes at \$27,000 was postponed at the suggestion of Mr. Taylor. Soon after the amount of the purchase price for the Emerald street plot had been made public Mr. Taylor said he received an offer from J. L. Shearer for a plot, on the block above Seneva between Fourth and Emerald, for \$26,000.

The city's request of Dr. Samuel Dixon, State Health Commissioner, for an extension of time in which to complete its sewer disposal system, prepared by City Solicitor Seitz, was approved by Council.

New ordinances introduced including the measure by Mr. Taylor providing for the taking over of the Helen Boyd Dull tract, one of the remaining links in the city parkway. Mr. Lynch offered an ordinance authorizing the widening of the highway between Boas and Pear and renaming the highway Grand street.
