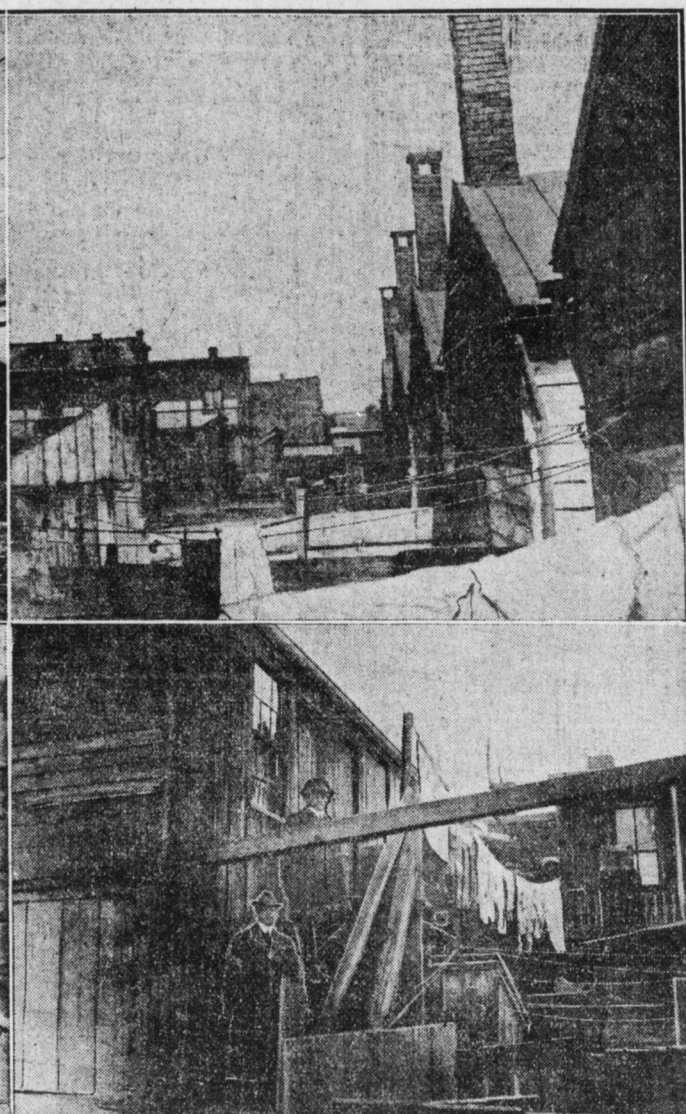

3,500,000 MEN TAKING PART IN GREATEST FIGHT OF EUROPEAN STRUGGLE
