

SPEEDY TRACK SQUAD TO REPRESENT STATE

Harrisburg Lads Will Run in U. of P. Relays; Preparing For Interscholastic Meet

State College, Pa., April 20.—Coach Martin expects to take a squad of the speediest trackmen that ever represented Penn State to Pennsylvania's relay races next Saturday.

For the pentathlon, Martin is developing Levi Lamb, the football man and wrestling captain, and Dambley, a freshman aspirant. In his trials yesterday Dambley showed much improvement in each of the five events.

"Dutch" Garland to Run In his trials yesterday Lamb cleared 19 feet 2 inches in the broad jump, threw the javelin 132 feet 10 inches.

State's four-mile team will be Schroeder, Entwistle, "Dutch" Garland and Huser. These men were chosen on the basis of their trials yesterday.

For the annual interscholastic track and field meet to be staged at Penn State on May 15, fourteen representative preparatory and high schools of the State have been entered.

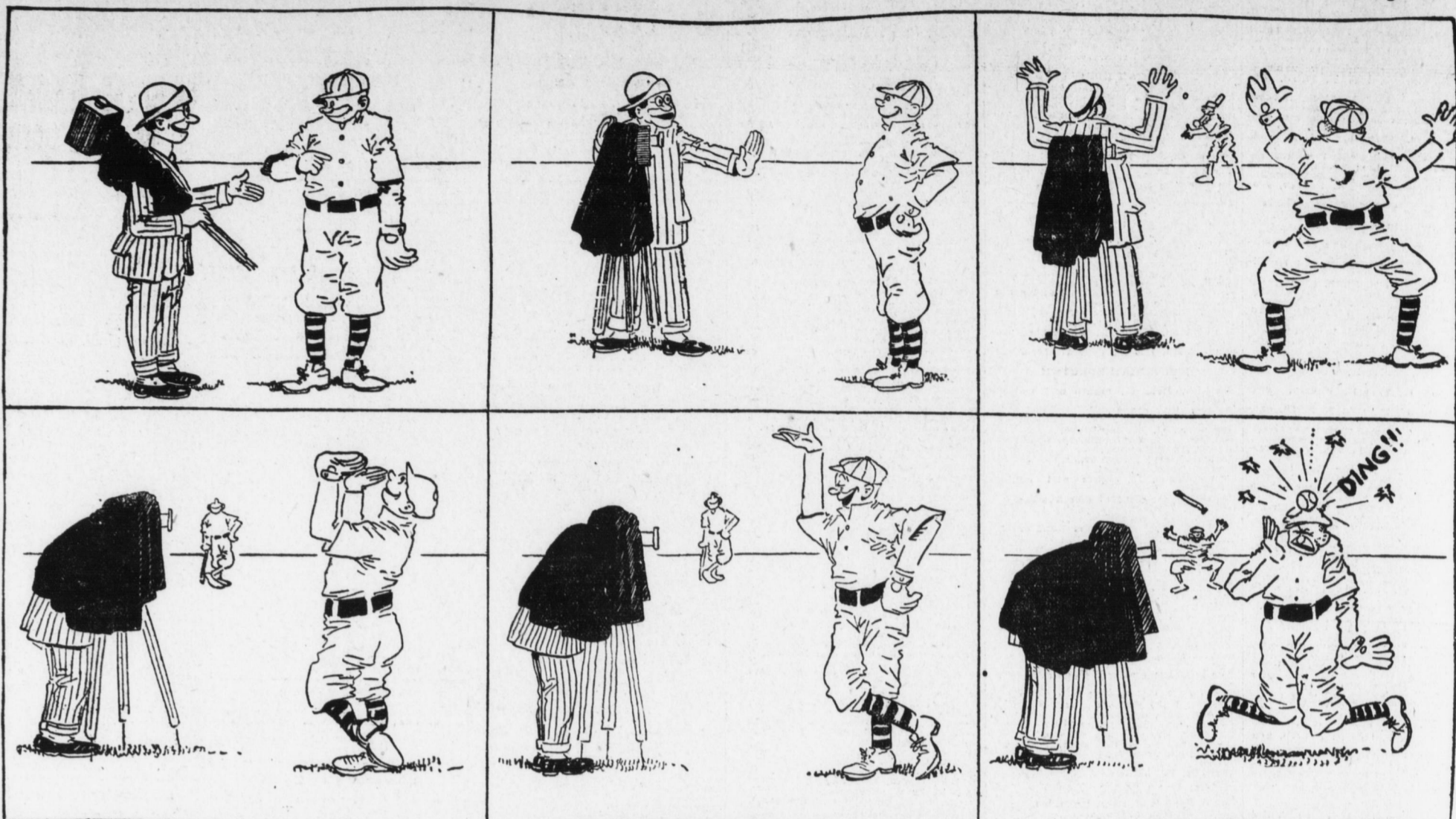
