New York, April 20. — Irregular tendencies were again operative at the opening of today's stock market. The opening result of yesterday's confusing scene, which was the feature of an initial sale of 1,000 shares of U. S. Steel, against yesterday's close of 34. Leaning was strongest of the day, with advances of one to three points in Copper, and one to two points in notably Mexican Petroleum. Later, the entire list moved forward, contributing to a further advance in metal prices.
