More than two hundred, it is said, have been refused admission each year because of lack of class-room and laboratory facilities. The college stands alone in not charging admission and is patronized principally by parents unable to send their children to expensive institutions. It is located in the country where the cost of living is not excessive. In the last sixty years it has been given but two buildings by private donors. The management says in that time it has not been given one dollar of endow-ment by an individual. It must de-pend wholly upon the state and na-tional government.

INJUNCTION AGAINST MOTOR CO.

Injunction proceedings to restrain P. B. Shaw, George Parkman, R. W. Mc-Connell, James A. Tanner and William Kennedy, said to be interested in the United Water, Gas and Electric Com-pany, from collecting water rents, and otherwise trying to take over the man-agement of the Williams Valley Water Company at Williamstown, were be-gun in the Dauphin county court this afternoon. The complaint was made by the Sterling Consolidated Electric Company which controls the water company, The plaintiff alleges that the defendants not only have made ef-forts to collect water rents totaling \$2,000 but that they have dismissed J. B. Whitworth as superintendent. The court fixed April 27 at 10 o'clock for hearing the injunction.

Moving Picture Censor

In the Senate last night a bill was in-troduced by Senator Smith, Philadel-phia, giving the State Fire Marshal authority to increase his force and to give him additional powers in all city and counties having a population less than 500,600.

and counties having a population less than 500,000. Among the bills reported from com-mittee was that repealing a portion of the nonpartisan ballot act. The bill in its present form repeals so much of the nonpartisan ballot act as applies to judges of courts of record, leaving the act stand as far as it relates to of-ficers in second class cities. The bill repealing the present mov-ing picture law and creating an entirely new act was reported from committee with numerous amendments. One of the principal amendments reduces the fees for examining films from \$2,50 to \$1. The Senate adjourned until Monday night.
