It is most significant that David was chosen for the throne when he was at work. Thus Christ chose His disciples. Thus our Lord himself came from the carpenter's shop. Thus Amos was drawn from the farm, and Elisha also. David tended sheep, as did Jacob and Moses. Saul was anointed as he was seeking his father's asses. The true worker is already a king. We are glad when we see the anointing oil on the forehead of the young David, as Miller, who was anointed as he was David was a shepherd's son. Millet, having in mind his boyhood, tenderly painted his wonderful "Angelus." He took it to Paris and hawked it about, but no one would have it. At last the Belgian minister gave him \$260 for it. Six years after Millet's death the picture sold for \$20,000, and in 1889 James G. Sullivan, president of the American Art Association, bought it for \$116,000. - Amos R.
