SHRUBS SUITABLE FOR THE LAWN
 [From Farm Life]
 Following is a list of ten shrubs which are especially well adapted to planting on the grounds around the farmhouse and which will prove a delight from early Spring until late Fall: Forsythia, showing masses of yellow flowers; early; Japanese quince, blooming in May and best planted where it is partly concealed by other shrubs in winter; the lilac, an old favorite in which several new forms are now offered; weigela, flowering in June in almost any soil and pretty the season through; bridal wreath (spiraea) a beautiful shrub which looks in June almost as though weighted down with snow; buddleia or butterfly bush, a new shrub from China which deserves a place in every garden for its bell-shaped colored flowers; are produced from July until the coming of frost; hydrangea paniculata, flowering in August and September as a lawn specimen, although it can be trimmed to suit any position; rose of Sharon (hibiscus), a September flowering shrub which has flowers resembling hollyhocks; high bush cranberry, flowering in June, but with ornamental scarlet berries which last well into the winter; snowberry, most valued for its white berries which hang on the branches until long after snow lies.
