**EXCITING TRACES LOST IN WALL STREET**

New York, May 10.—Taking its cue from London, where Americans showed a firm tone, the local stock market opened with no trace of the excitement which attended the later sessions of last week. There were gains of 1 to 1 1/2 and 2 points in prominent issues including the international list, a number of specialties of mixed character. Bethlehem Steel was the only war stock to record a severe decline, falling over four points. Initial advances were lost after the opening, but the setback was orderly. Trading was moderate, with an underlying note of caution.

The following Rules and Regulations of the Bureau of Heat and Sanitation were passed by the City Council and signed by His Honor, the Mayor, and are published as required by the Act of Assembly, approved June 27, 1913.

No milk or cream visibly contaminated shall be exposed for sale.

No cream shall be exposed for sale at a temperature of such fine shall be adulterated within the meaning of these regulations.

Special of baby milk must conform to the standard of Certified Milk.

Milk sold as pasteurized milk must be marked or have a label on the milk and must conform with the standards of pasteurized milk.

Milk cream sold shall be labeled as such and must contain at least 36 per cent butter fat.

Milk bottles shall be used as milk containers only and all dealers shall be required to use their own bottles.

Any persons violating any of the regulations of the Bureau of Health and Sanitation shall, upon conviction before the Mayor or any Alderman of the City (unless otherwise provided for by City Ordinance or Act of Assembly) be subject to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100), and costs, and be imprisoned for thirty (30) days.
