DIPLOMAT PREDICTS

Minister From Argentine Says Western Hemisphere Will Be Independent of Old World

New York, May 18.—Heaviness was the dominant feature of to-day's early stock market, all branches of the list registering declines. Numerous leaders were affected to the extent of a point or more as were also the speculative specialties. Dealings were again extremely moderate and plainly of professional origin. United States and South America that will result in rolling unlimited wealth into the coffers of both countries and Steel, Reading and Union Pacific were singled out for bear pressure.
