court under \$500 bail.





Public Service Commission Finds That Franchise Was Not Violated; Other Cases

In the complaint of the borough of Mt. Union against the Mt. Union Water Company, the Public Service Commission in an opinion made public last evening finds that the company did not violate the franchise ordinance under which it operates when it increased the rates, and that these rates which became effective August 15, 1914, are not unreasonable and excessive. The quantity of the water supplied is adequate for domestic consumption but the commission orders that the stream and reserve at Singer's Gap must be properly protected against pollution, and the company must report to the commission not later than July 1 of this year as to the means employed to furnish this protection. Tests of the water pressure must also be made during the months of July, August, September and October.

The commission has issued an or-

The commission has issued an order restraining the Big Spring Electric Company, a Cumberland county concern, from putting into effect the proposed schedule providing for an increase in its rates for power. The complaint was brought by J. S. Elliott and others of Newville and it was alleged that the proposed rates were greatly in excess of the charges of other companies for like service.

In another opinion the commission declares that it has not the power, under the act creating it, to compel a public service company to extend its facilities beyond the territory covered by its charter or amendments thereto. The City of Scranton passed an ordinance authorizing the extension and operation of the lines of the Scranton Railways Company from the present end of the tracks in Luzerne street to other localities. The company refused to accept the ordinance or make the extension and the City of Scranton filed a complaint with the commission. The complaint was dismissed.

The commission refused to approve the contract for street lighting entered into by the Township of Jenkins, Luzerne county, and the Jenkins Township Electric Light, Heat and Power Company.
