Needle in Tower City Woman's Body 30 Years

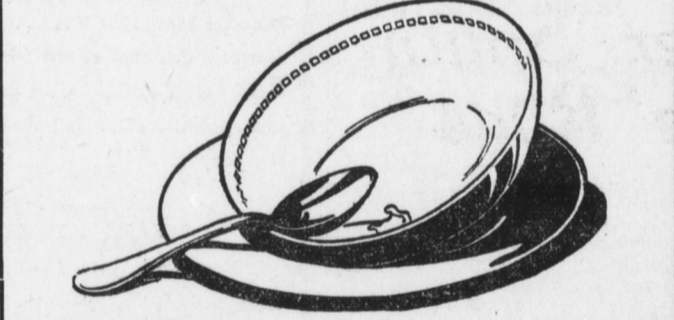
