CONFERENCE SHOWN IN STOCK MARKETS

War Shares Were Most Conspicuous in Wall Street This Morning

New York, June 7. - Increased confidence was shown by the stock market on the resumption of trading to-day, prices in general making substantial gains. War shares were most conspicuous, General Electric advancing 4 1/2 points to the new high record of 165 1/2 while Westinghouse, Truitt Steel and allied stocks advanced 1 to 2. Automobile shares were next in favor, General Motors advancing five points to the new high record of 157. Canadian Pacific was the feature of the international group, gaining 1 1/2 against 3 1/2 in London. Pressure soon waned off its rise, but without effect elsewhere.

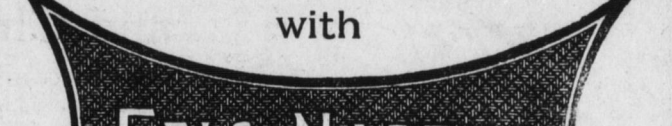

GERMANS IN OREGON ARE DISPLEASED WITH WILSON

Portland, Ore., June 7. - The Federated German Speaking Societies of Oregon, comprising forty-eight organizations, last night adopted the following resolution, which was made public to-day: We declare our dissent from the decision of the President and his Secretary of State to the effect that the law of nations, or any law or compact - unless there be a secret one - compels this Government to permit the present enormous and increasing export of war material. We denounce the inhumanity and injustice of this position and we regret deeply that the President has thus far placed a ban against the unbiased discussion of this subject by Congress.

APPEALS MADE TO PRESS

Madrid, June 7, via Paris. - Reports received from Morocco state an expeditionary force has taken two positions occupied by Moorish rebels near Moulay el Khatib, and the expeditionary force continues to push ahead. The Government has appealed to the Spanish press to abandon all diatribe and increasing in order to avoid misunderstandings which might interfere with the maintenance of neutrality.
