W. H. HUTTER IN TOWN.

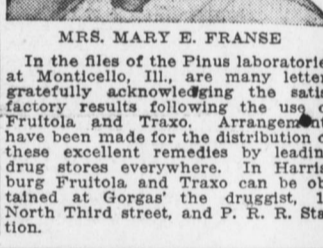
