DAY'S STOCK SALES

Rubber, Westinghouse and Steel Supply Forty Per Cent. of Transactions

New York, June 25. - Sales in the first hour barely approximated 100,000 shares, Rubber, Westinghouse and Steel supplying over 40 per cent. of the whole.

Stocks were offered on the rise, a large part of the early gains being lost. Later weakness in the Southwest group, including Missouri Pacific stock and convertible bonds, Rock Island and M. K. & T. issues, created nervousness.

The usual rumors accompanied the fall in these stocks, coupled with adverse crop advice.

In other quarters the market was firm with general recoveries from the weakness which marked the close of the preceding session. Canadian Pacific, Reading and Erie, and a number of copper mines made initial fractional gains which soon were increased to a point or more.
