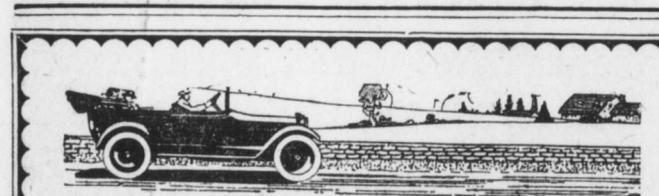

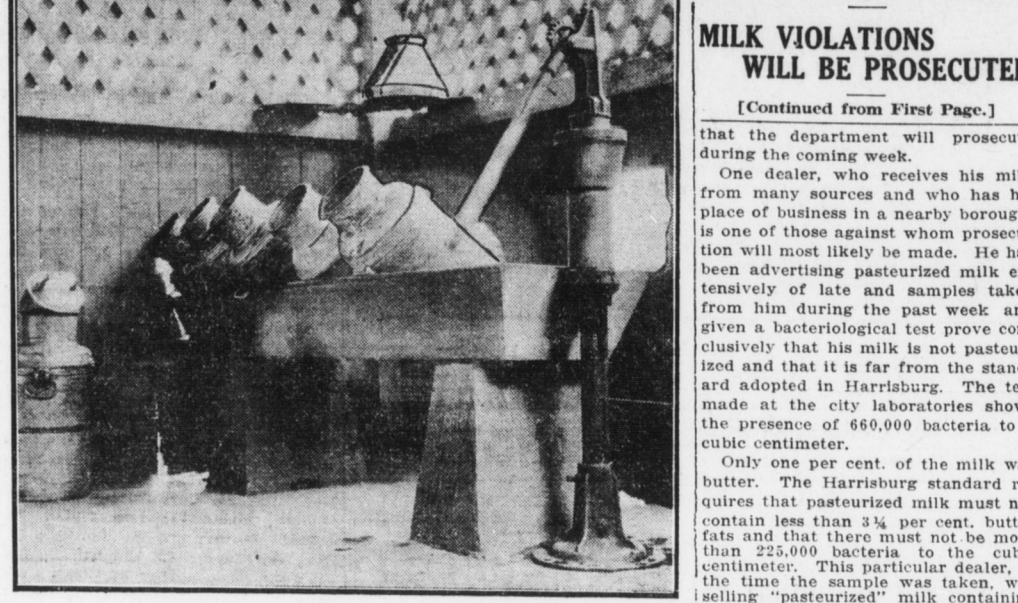
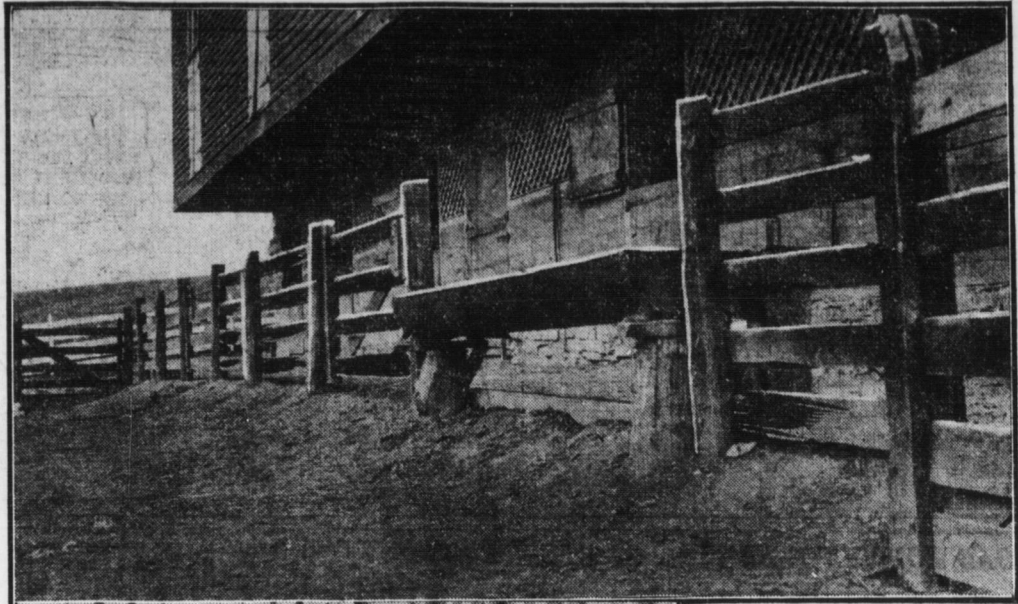

SCENES ON WELL-KEPT FARMS IN CUMBERLAND COUNTY



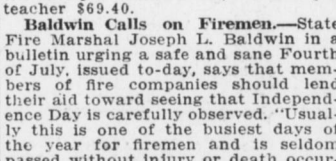
