WAR STOCKS AGAIN DOMINANT FEATURE

Industrial and Equipment Shares Rise One and Two Points During Morning

New York, July 13.—War stocks were again the dominant feature at the opening of today's market, with new records for the Bethlehem Steel, New York Airbrake and General Motors. American Cap, which bears some relation to war issues also sold at a record quotation. Likewise Republic Steel preferred. Various industrial and equipment shares rose 1 to 2 points with 7 points for Cuban Sugar and an additional 12 for American Coal products. Such speculative favorites as U. S. Steel, Union Pacific and Reading were practically unchanged while St. Paul and Canadian Pacific were heavy.
