WAR SHARES PROMISE GREATER ACTIVITIES

Canadian Pacific Reflected Further Pressure Despite Its Substantial Gain

By Associated Press New York, July 15. - War shares gave promise of greater activity and prices at the opening of today's trading. Gain of one to almost two points were registered by Bethlehem Crucible Steel, Westinghouse General Motors and Baldwin Locomotive, with a new high record for the latter. Some of the more representative issues yesterday's irregularity was renewed, Southern Pacific displaying marked interest. Canadian Pacific also reflected further pressure, despite its substantial gain in the London market where other international stocks were variably lower. Reactions from early prices were general before the end of the half hour.
