Parls—It is estimated, according to the latest figures, that 13 per cent. of the men hit since the inauguration of the war of trenches are wounded in the head. Doctors Dentu and Deuraigne recommend the use of metallic skull caps as a protection. Of fifty-five soldiers wounded in the head it reated by Doctor Deuraigne, forty-two had no such protection, and twenty-three of these suffered from fractures and nineteen from scalp wounds. The remaining thirteen were provided with metallic skull caps and five of these were only slightly wounded. Doctor Deuraigne declares that officers and surgeons are favorable to this protection and if the soldiers are hostile it is because only two or three sizes are made and in most cases fit badly.

SAILING VESSELS INCREASE
