The Harrington Milis grade crossing over the Delaware, ackawanna & Western Railroad at Montrose was the subject of complaint filed with the Public Service Commission to-day by E. H. True, Burgess of Montrose, and F. A. Davies, attorney.

The complaint alleges that the crossing is over a much traveled highway and is dangerous; that the railroad company does not protect it with watchmen, gates or warning bells. The railroad has been ordered to answer the complaint, and Acting Chairman W. D. B. Ainey has directed John S. Dohoney to examine the site and make recommendations.

Mr. Ainey, who resides at Montrose, and who is familiar with the situation, said: "This crossing is a danger-ous one and needs to be protected; several accidents have occurred there, and the railroad company will no to doubt be ordered to place a bell or erect gates as the inspector may recommend."

The investigator of accidents of the commission has been advised that a crossing watchman will be installed at Seward, on the line of the Pennsylvania Railroad. The petition for this protection was filed by the chief burgess of Seward, I. L. Hedges, who is particularly interested in the welfare of the school children who have occasion to cross the tracks. He expressed his appreciation for the interest the commission has taken in the matter.
