New York, July 20.—War shares were again heavily sold at the opening of today's market with a further weakness in Crucible Steel in which the initial offerings was a block of 2,000 shares at 39 1/2 to 39, against yesterday's closing price of 41 3/4. Bethlehem Steel, General Electric and Allis-Chalmers preferred, also yielded 1 to 2 points with minor losses in Westinghouse, Standard American and American Can. The more prominent railway stocks showed a contrary course. Union Pacific, Canadian Pacific and Reading rising 1/2 point or more. Crucible made a slight rally before the end of the half hour.
