be erected here to America's first military heroine.

The sciptor selected is J. Otto Schwerzer of Philadelphia. The figure of Molly Pitcher will be seven feet high and two bas reliefs, one depicting the woman buried at Carlisle as nursing wounded on the battlefield at Monmouth and another in the familiar pose of serving camon at the battle. Two bronze tablets will finish off a grante pedestal and base. The work is to be finished by June 15, 1916.

The dedicatory services will be held in Carlisle on Wednesday, June 28, 1916, the anniversary of the battle of Monmouth, at which time it is likely that patriotic organizations and women's clubs from all over America will be represented.
