Dear Sir—Answering your request of 20th instant as to whether the city can complete the construction of the intercepting sewer and apply the funds and to pay the cost of the work incessary to such completion, I beg to submit the following:

Contracts for the construction of this improvement were regularly and legally let and appropriations made for the payment of the estimated cost thereof. The money in hand can therefore be legally applied to the payment of any work or materials furnished in conformity with said contracts, regardless of when such work was done or materials furnished.
