London, July 27, 11.38 A. M.—The magnitude of the German enveloping movement in the eastern field now is absorbing the attention of the British officials and public. The latest reports show that General von Buelow's 30,000 cavalry have turned southward from Riga and are within eighty miles of the rallway connecting Petrograd with Warsaw.

In this way the northern German Il line is closing in on the main northern railway artery to the Russian capital, while the southern army similarly is approaching the main southern artery truning to Odessa.
