London, July 29, 11:55 a. m.—Except from Sokal, Galicia, where the Russians claim by a counter offensive to have thrown back the Austro-Hungarians across the Dniester river, little definite news reached London this morning from the Eastern battle front. To the east of the Narew river, the extent of the German advance from Ronan is marked by the capture of the village of Goworowo which lies only six miles from the river.
