Crowd Always Gathers to See Wounded Come in

London, July 31 (correspondence of the Associated Press).—On the sights of London is the arrival of wounded soldiers at Charing Cross station. The crowd gathers there about 5 o'clock every afternoon. Although not a day has passed since the early part of the war without the arrival of a varying number of victims of shot, and the sight never lessens. Charing Cross station used to be the brightest and most interesting station in London, for most of the travel with the continent passed there. It stands just off Trafalgar Square, near the center of the west end shopping district. Before the arrival of the Red Cross train the ambulance motors form a line in a narrow side street. Ordinarily motorcars are used for the slightly wounded and ambulances for the badly wounded. The platforms in the great station are kept clear, but the sightseers, who are largely women, gather in the forecourt waiting for the big iron gates to open and let out the stream of slow-moving cars, which pass from the side street into the station and then out.
