One hundred narrow-gauge locomo

tives of the Pechot type, each

tives of the Pechot type, each mounted on two bogies and provided with double-barreled boilers and two fire boxes, were recently made in America and shipped abroad for the use of the French Government. Al-though these engines are of a design entirely foreign and were constructed according to metric measurements, they were built and the last one ship-ped seven weeks after the order was received. Because of its great flexibility, which allows its use on narrow un-even tracks where sharp curves are frequent, this engine is being em-ployed by the French, particularly in drawing its munition trains over hur-riedly built lines leading to its war camps. A picture of the engine is a feature of the August Popular Me-chanics Magazine.
