IN WEEK'S MARKETS

Crop Report and U. S. Steel's July Statement Among More Constructive Features

By Associated Press

New York, Aug. 14.—The week in the stock market was crowded with interesting developments, although interest in the market itself again converged mainly around the war specialities, including some issues of minor importance. The course of the more important stocks, particularly the railroads, was governed to a greater extent than usual by the several decisions handed down by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

First among these was the meager increase in freight rates granted to the western roads, while the second ordered a sharp cut in rates now charged by the anthracite carriers, and yet another was of favorable import to the soft coal lines. Between these varying decisions the market for railways was somewhat unsettled and a considerable part of the improvement made in the first days was lost later. Other standard issues were affected to the extent of 1 to 3 points.

Broader and more significant developments included the Mexican situation and the further sensational decline in rates of exchange on London and Paris to lowest quotations in over a generation. Negotiations for the placing of additional credits here for British and French interests are known to be in progress, this being regarded as the only permanent form of relief.
