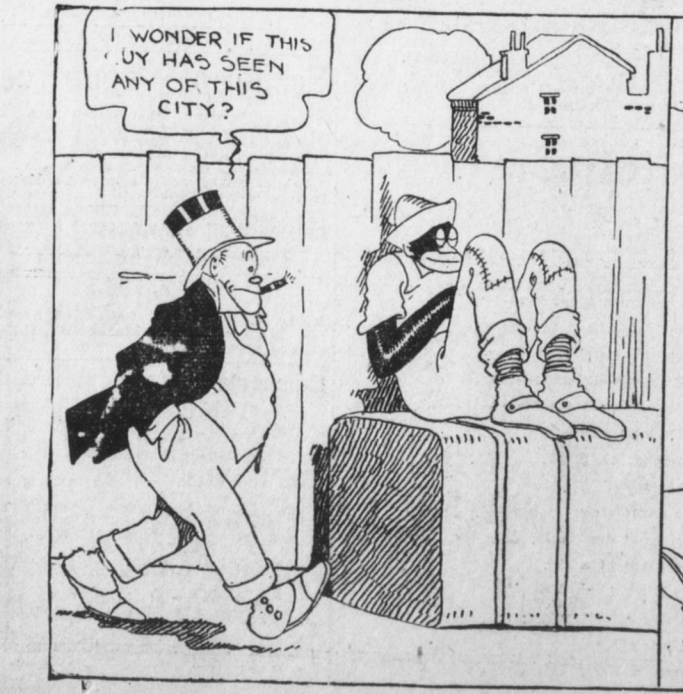

### HALF MILLION FOR STATE GAME WORK

Treasurer Young Sets Aside Big Sums Received From Hunters' License Act

Over half a million dollars has been set aside by State Treasurer Young from the general funds of the State Treasury as special funds established by the last Legislature, all to be devoted to game purposes and payment of bounties for the killing of destructive animals and birds. A short time ago \$161,000 was set aside to establish the State fire insurance fund and the Treasurer is preparing to create the workmen's compensation insurance fund. When this action is taken there will be seven funds in the treasury.

The money set aside in the last few days is all revenue from hunters' licenses. The sum of \$308,200 was allotted for game preserves, feeding, protection, distribution, purchase and propagation of game and \$240,820.47 to reimburse counties for bounties paid for noxious animals and birds. These two sums represent the income from hunters' licenses prior to April 15, 1915. The revenue from such licenses received since April 15 will be put into a fund subject to appropriation by the next Legislature.

Among the floats planned for the street demonstration on the afternoon of the 26th are the following: "The Signing of the Declaration of Independence," "Penn's Treaty with the Indians," "The Birth of the American Flag," "Betsy Ross Designing the First Flag," "Liberty Bell," "The Little Red School House," "Inside of a School Room," "Washington Crossing the Delaware," "Goddess of Liberty" and others. The floats will be of special interest to school children.
