Reduce Its Fire Risk How Harrisburg can materials duce its mercantile fire insurance risks under the new "standard rating" established by the Board of Fire Understandard How Harrisburg can materially retablished by the Board of Fire Under-writers, was explained in detail to City Council this afternoon by Attor-

City Council this afternoon by Attorney J. E. B. Cunningham, counsel for the Chamber of Commerce. Edwin S. Herman, president of the Planning Commission, and Secretary McColgin, of the Chamber, attended the session. Harrisburg is penalized, according to the report of Mr. Cunningham, sixteen cents per hundred on its mercanriel fire risks based on the standard rate of twenty cents.

Forty or more methods of reducing the risks, fixed by certain number of points were explained. These were decided upon after the Fire Underwriters had made a thorough survey of the city.

The same principles, Mr. Cunningham pointed out, could be applied to dwellings and he has no doubt that the insurance risks on dwellings will be materially decreased. The Chamber of Commerce, he said, was particularly interested in the mercantile rates.
