Editor Says U. S. Plan in Haiti Is "Unfair" New York, Sept. 16.—Ernest Chauvet, editor of a newspaper of Port au Prince, Haiti, who says he was sent here unofficially by the Haitian government announced to-day that he had addressed a letter to President Wilson declaring that the proposed convention between the United States and Haiti for the control of the Haitian finances is unfair in the extreme.

EMPEROR GRANTS AMNESTY Turin, Sept. 15, via Paris, Sept. 14.—The Gazzetta Del Popolo says it has received a dispatch from Petrograd stating that Emperor Nicholas has granted amnesty to all political prisoners. The number accepted is said to be more than 100,000.
